OVERVIEW

Tourism report consist of Tourism and Events activities that have been carried out from December 2019 to May 2020 across Cobar Shire Council. This report provides council with an updated status report over six months, relating to the Great Cobar Heritage Centre activities.

TOURISM

The Great Cobar Heritage Centre status over six months is a total of 3044 visitors to the Museum and Visitors Information Centre. Due to COVID-19 restrictions forcing the centre to shut down to the public this has affected our visitors' stats, March prior to COVID-19 was tracking to be one of our best months at the Centre.

Coach bookings were looking strong for our peak season with 8 coaches booked for the months May through to July. Unfortunately, all these booking had to be cancelled due to COVID-19. As the museum in now closed for access we remain to promote and grow the coach group market with providing on board town tours whilst the museum is under renovation to secure our coaches to visit Cobar, these bookings will start when group travel resumes.

The temporary Visitors Information Centre has now opened and operating out of 43 Linsley Street, a shared space with the family day care staff. The centre will be operating at this temporary space until the museum renovations are complete. The centre consists of visitor's information services and small shop display.

TRADESHOWS

Great Cobar Heritage Centre staff attended the Melbourne Caravan & Camping Super Show at the Melbourne showgrounds in February 2020, from the 20th-25th. The trade show was attended by 45,726 people over the five-day period. Staff representative from the Great Cobar Heritage Centre attended the tradeshow with the Kidman Way committee who attended the exhibition as exhibitors to promote the Kidman Way "backtrack to the outback". Staff hand delivered local marketing materials promoting Cobar tourist attractions, events and festivals as well with promoting the Kidman Way tourism route.

The Exhibit consisted of promotional material of Kidman Way brochure "backtrack to the outback", local brochures from Kidman Way towns, local area flyers and activities brochures, digital media advertising, videography display and local produce giveaways from around the region. Grey Mardi Gras marketing material was handed delivered and advertised at the shows.

The purpose of attendance to attract target market travellers, capture travelling trends, grow tourism for Cobar, increase visitation to Cobar and promote tourism attractions. Couples aged 60+ were the main visitors to the stand throughout the week with more family groups and younger crowds visiting on the weekend, 87% of interactions were people from Melbourne and surrounding areas. People confirmed for touring the Kidman Way this year were pre-dominantly traveling from April-July.

Other tradeshows planned were Sydney Royal Easter show at Sydney Show ground, exhibiting with the Far North West Joint Organisation, Sydney Caravan and Camping Super Show in Rosehill and Melbourne Leisurefest at Sandown Melbourne exhibiting the Kidman Way promotional committee. All these shows were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

FESTIVALS AND EVENTS

Australia Day

Australia Day celebrations were carried out on Sunday 26th January 2020 at Cobar Memorial Swimming Pool. Dr Clio Cresswell was this year's Australia Day Ambassador, Clio PH. D is an Australian mathematician, author, TED Talk and YouTube success. Clio thoroughly enjoyed her time in Cobar as she extended her stay for four extra days to soak up as much as she could out of Cobar and surrounding areas. Australia Day celebrations consisted of a full day program of events and activities which included triathlon, business house swimming relays, duck race, naturalization ceremony, Australia day awards & novelty events. Seven people were naturalised on Australia Day and a fantastic response this year for Australia Day Awards nominations with 62 nominations received. Deputy Mayor Peter Abbott conducted the official ceremonies and officially opened the 150 Years celebration of Cobar with the unveiling of the 150 Years logo.

A full program of activities and events were held across the day with the CATS running the Triathlon, the Cobar Senior Men's Swimming Club the Yabbies hosting the Business House swimming relay events, Cobar Youth Council hosted the Great Duck Race and Deputy Mayor Peter Abbott, Janette Booth and Demi Smith conducted the Australia Day Awards and naturalization ceremonies. Cobar Rotary Club kindly donated their time once again to cooking and serve the BBQ provided by Cobar Shire Council and Cobar Youth Council and Cobar Youth & Fitness Centre Manager Narelle Kriz ran a variety of games and activities for everyone to enjoy throughout the day.

62 nominations received for this year's awards ceremony and the judging panel consisted of five members representatives included Cobar Shire Council Councillors, Staff & Community Member.

Seniors Week

Cobar Seniors Week was celebrated from the 9-13 March 2020. A full program over the five-day period was planned for all seniors to participate in with a range of different events and activities that were held at different venues around the Cobar community. All events on the program were well attended by members of the Cobar and surrounding communities. All events were free to attend to and there was something for everyone to enjoy from social activities, active skills, entertainment and inter-generation activities. Seniors week 2020 was designed to encourage seniors, families and friends to get involved, be socially active and enjoy themselves.

Grey Mardi Gras

Grey Mardi Gras was planned for the 3-6 April 2020 a full 4-day program was designed to promote and increase tourism to Cobar. The program included Stomp, Jive & Bump Dinner Dance, Street Parade, Markets, Show & Show Car show, Mr & Miss Mardi Gras competition, Bob Awards, Busking, Gig on the Grass with 6 Hours of entertainment, kids amusement, food vendors, markets and live performances, bus tour, Trivia, Bingo, Bowls, Golf and lots of novelty events over the course of the weekend. This year's Grey Mardi Gras attracted new visitors, caravan groups and tour group that had booked into all events across the weekend. Unfortunately, this event was cancelled due to the COVID-19 crisis.

150 Years of Cobar

A full program of activities and events had been planned to celebrate the 150 years of Cobar celebration. The committee had worked together to create a program that each month of the calendar year of 2020 there was a celebration, event or activity. The 150 years logo was unveiled the Australia Day celebration and was marketed on all marketing material for the 150 years celebration along with local sporting jerseys of different codes of the Cobar community. Due to the current COVID-19 crisis some events have been cancelled and all future events on the 150 years calendar have been postponed until further notice.

The Big Beer Can - Voted Best Big Attraction

In May "Lets go Caravanning and Camping" ran a competition to determine Australia's Best Big Attraction. The competition was hosted on Facebook and 16 competitors were selected for the competition. Approximately over 44,000 votes were received throughout the competition and Cobar received almost 15,500 of them. Cobar advanced through four rounds to take out the Win and being voted Australia's Best Big Attraction.

Voting rounds consisted of Round One the Can winning against the Boxing Croc (75% to 25% Votes), Round Two wining against the Big Bogan (51% to 49%, Round Three- wining against Ned Kelly (62% to 38%) and the Grand Final win against the Lobster (50.1% to 49.9%). Every round Cobar lead the entire votes tally the competition was a big win for Cobar and showed the competitiveness and passion of our little community, attracting lots of attention from all over Australia.

MUSEUM UPGRADES

The Projects team has been working closely with the Architects with the development of the upcoming project. Lynn Collins has been appointed from the Museum Advisory council to assist with curatorial consultation. Lynn is working closely with the projects team and curator during the planning process and for curatorial advice and exhibition upgrades during the project. Gabrielle Tydd has been appointed as the Graphic designer for the Museum and is working closely with the project team.

Detailed consultations with architects, Dunn and Hillam, are ongoing. These have involved a great deal of negotiation around issues such as legislative requirements for disability access, which not only influences entry to the building but also flow and movement through the spaces. Progress has been made in envisioning display spaces in terms of lighting and power needs, potential use of technology, and visual presentation. Colour schemes have been delivered to review and approve.

The community has also been consulted. Workshops with the Mt Grenfell Board were very useful in developing ideas with the Ngiyampaa Wangaaybuwaan people. The general community were invited to "Future Tours" of the proposed museum journey; comments were extremely positive. Unfortunately, only two of the four future tours planned went ahead due to COVID-19 shutdowns.

Staff are currently video graphing the current museum exhibition space for future historical documentation and online media and exhibition content.

The Museum is now fully closed to the Public and the decant process been under way for removal of all existing exhibition and fixtures inside the building. Museum to be fully vacant by July and ready for construction.

TOURISM COMMITTEE

The Tourism Committee continued to meet on a monthly basis to discuss, organise, and promote tourism, plan festivals and events. The committee were currently organising the Grey Mardi Gras and 150 year of Cobar celebrations for 2020 prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. Committee meetings are currently on hold until further COVID19 restrictions are lifted.

COLLABORATION

The Great Cobar Heritage Centre continues to work with neighboring Visitors Centre's to cross promote and increase tourism. Staff continue to update ATDW website and work with local business to help promote and update information.

Tourism Staff continue to collaboration with community groups such as the Market committee, Cobar Business association, Cobar Arts Council, Dust Bowl Fuel Burners, Mining representatives from CSA and Aurelia, Youth council, Roy Butlers office and Cobar Public & Cobar High School. Collaboration with the Cobar Business Association continues with regular communication and continually working together to engage and support local business in

business growth. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 we are unable to meet on a monthly basis but remain to keep ongoing contact via email and phone.

Cobar Shire Council staff continue to collaborate with the Cobar Business Association with regular communication, planning workshops and attend events and meetings hosted by both parties. Recently council staff worked with Cobar Business Association in engaging a consultant from "retail revamp" to engage and assist Cobar Shop owners to improve, transform and work on creating an amazing customer experience and optimal sales environment in the local Businesses in Cobar. This service included assisting with retail design, visual merchandising education and inspiring creativity within their shop displays and space.
